


Reduction of Federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act Funding

Iowa's funding from the federal Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act over the last 13 years has been reduced by 85% - from \$4,641,700 in FFY99 to \$663,199 in FFY12. The FFY12 cuts eliminated two block grant programs available to states, which leaves two - Title II State Formula Grants, and Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG). The Title V Local Delinquency Prevention Grant and the Enforcing Underage Drinking Laws (EUDL) Block Grant will not be awarded to states in FY12.

The following graph shows the reductions in OJJDP funds available to Iowa for juvenile justice.



In addition to the loss of the federal OJJDP funds there was a cut to state juvenile justice funds during SFY01 and SFY02. In SFY01 the state funds available for juvenile crime prevention was reduced by 50%, and in SFY02 these funds were eliminated. When added to the loss of the federal juvenile justice funds there has been a decrease of 89% to funds available for juvenile delinquency prevention programming in Iowa.
