GENDER EQUITY PRIORITY AREA GOAL

Strengthen, through collaboration, the continuum of care for females involved in the juvenile justice system.

Objective 1: Advocate for legislation, policies and rules that create an appropriate level of in-state care for high risk, delinquent young women;

- Action Step 1:** Meet with key legislators
- Action Step 4:** Members contact their public officials directly.
- Action Step 5:** Press
- Action Step 7:** Get information/data on out-of-state placement
