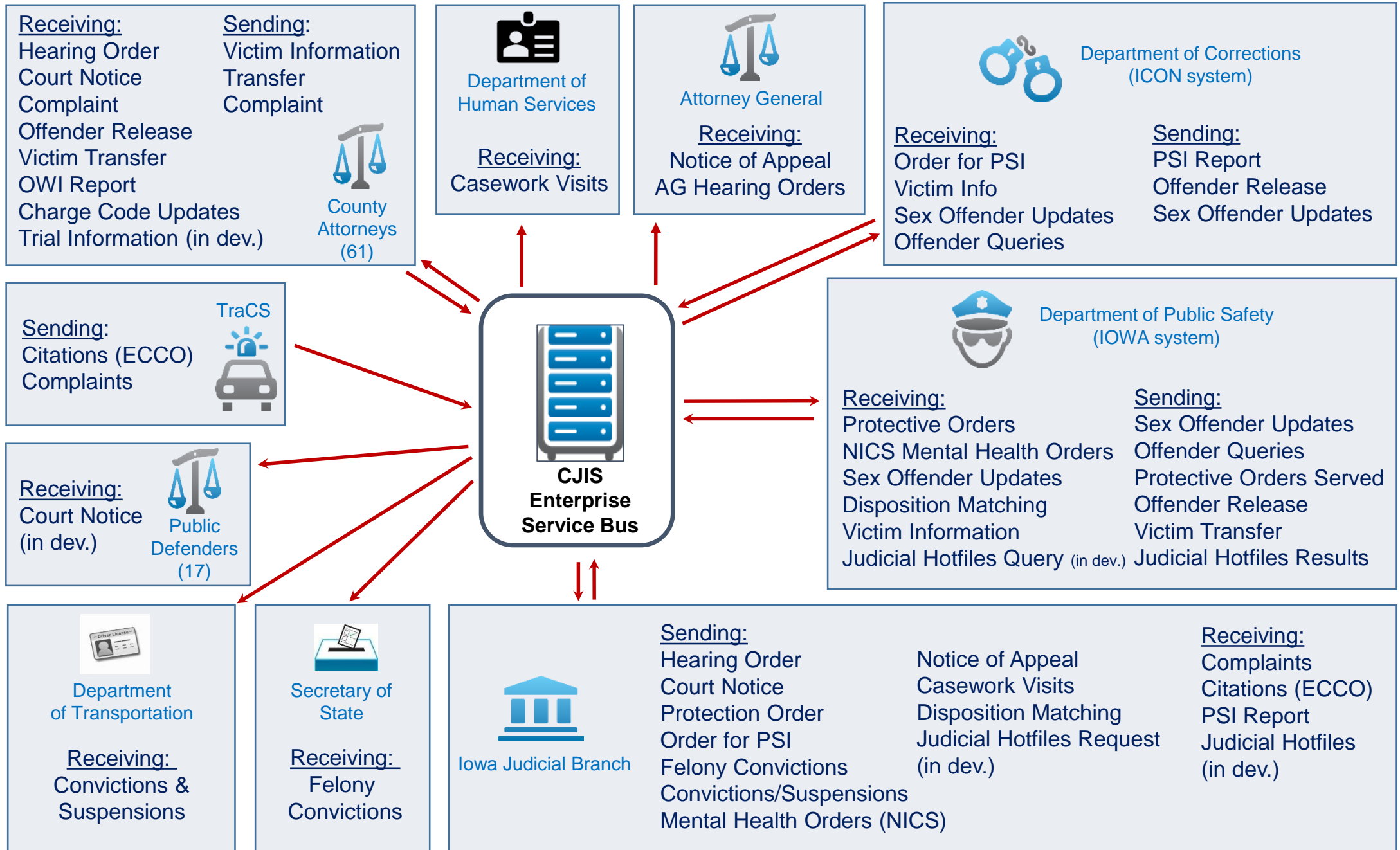


CJIS EXCHANGES – AGENCY TO AGENCY



Iowa is a national leader in criminal justice information sharing. Since 2007, Iowa's Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) has served as a "system of systems" that integrates and shares criminal justice information among Iowa's criminal justice agencies in a seamless, real-time, and secure manner.

Housed within the Division of Criminal and Juvenile Justice Planning, CJIS makes Iowa's criminal justice system more efficient and effective by allowing agencies to share or receive critical information.

In a typical month, CJIS performs around 450,000 separate secure information exchanges for:

- 240 local police departments
- 99 county sheriffs
- Iowa State Patrol
- 61 county attorney offices
- Iowa Judicial Branch
- Department of Corrections
- Department of Transportation (Motor Vehicle Enforcement, Motor Vehicle Computer Lab, and Bureau of Investigation)
- Department of Public Safety
- Department of Natural Resources
- Department of Human Services
- Secretary of State
- Attorney General
- Iowa State Parks
- State Public Defender (in development)
