### CRIMINAL COMPLAINTS & CITATIONS

240 local police departments, all 99 county sheriffs, 2 university police departments, 1 airport police unit, and the State Fair Police rely on CJIS to transmit all criminal complaints and citations to the local courthouse or county attorney through TraCS.

### COUNTY ATTORNEY: HEARING ORDER, COURT NOTICE, OFFENDER RELEASE, VICTIM TRANSFER, CHARGE CODE UPDATES

County Attorneys in 56 counties rely on automated case information sent directly from the courts to their case management system, eliminating data re-entry. They also rely on automatic updates to the criminal charge code from CJIS. Prosecutors also utilize CJIS to assist with their duty to inform registered victims of offender release.

### DOT TRAFFIC CONVICTIONS & COURT DISPOSITION

Courts in all 99 counties automatically transmit traffic convictions and other sentences impacting driver's license status to the Department of Transportation.

### DISPOSITION MATCHING

Every time a court enters a final criminal disposition, the record is sent in real-time to the Department of Public Safety, keeping the state's Computerized Criminal History (CCH) accurate and up to date.

### SEX OFFENDER UPDATES

This 2-way exchange triggers automatic updates between the Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Safety for the addresses of registered sex offenders, keeping the DCI's Sex Offender Registry current.

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## PROTECTIVE ORDER & PROTECTIVE ORDER SERVED

When a judge enters a Protective Order, that order is immediately sent to DPS and local law enforcement. When the Protective Order is served, notification is sent to the Attorney General VINE system, enabling victims immediate access to that information during the most volatile and dangerous time for that victim.

## SECRETARY OF STATE – FELON FILE

The courts send every new felon's information to the Secretary of State, keeping records of eligible voters current.

## PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATION REQUESTS & REPORTS

Judges' requests for Pre-Sentence Investigation Reports are automatically transmitted to the Department of Corrections. Once completed, the Pre-Sentence Investigation Reports are transmitted back to the Judicial Branch.

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## NOTICE OF APPEAL

The Attorney General is notified when a Notice of Appeal is filed on a case where the AG will become a party.

## NICS

Following the 2007 fatal shootings at Virginia Tech by an assailant who had a history of mental health orders, Congress expanded the National Instant Check System (NICS). This exchange automatically populates the FBI NICS database with mental health related court orders and judgments of Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity.

## DHS CASEWORK

This exchange assists Juvenile Court Officers in reporting time spent with delinquent youth during foster care case visits. This time must be reported to DHS for purposes of federal reimbursement.
