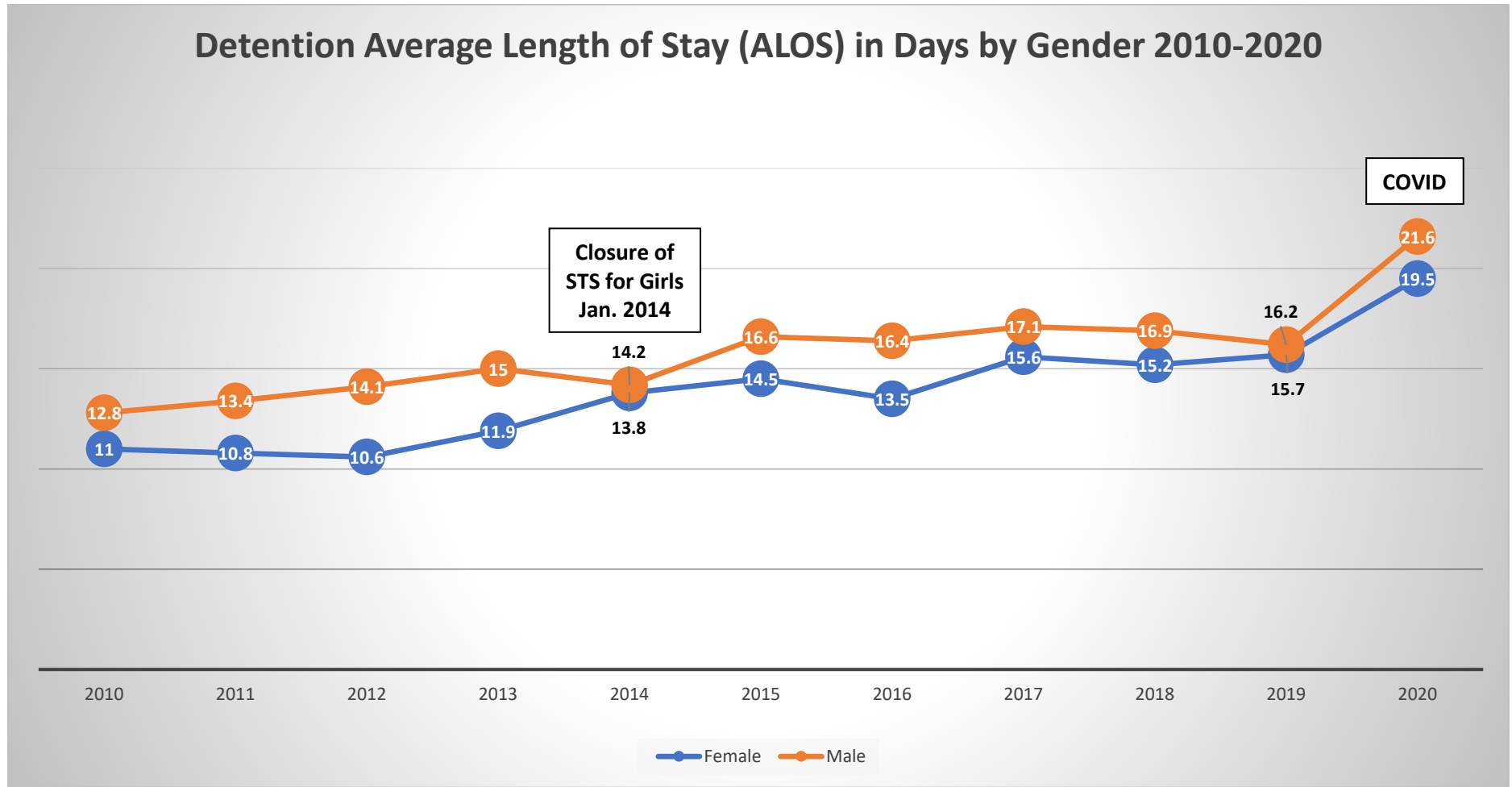


All cohorts of youth represented below are under the jurisdiction of Juvenile Court Services. This excludes adult court waiver youth, out-of-state youth and federal hold youth.

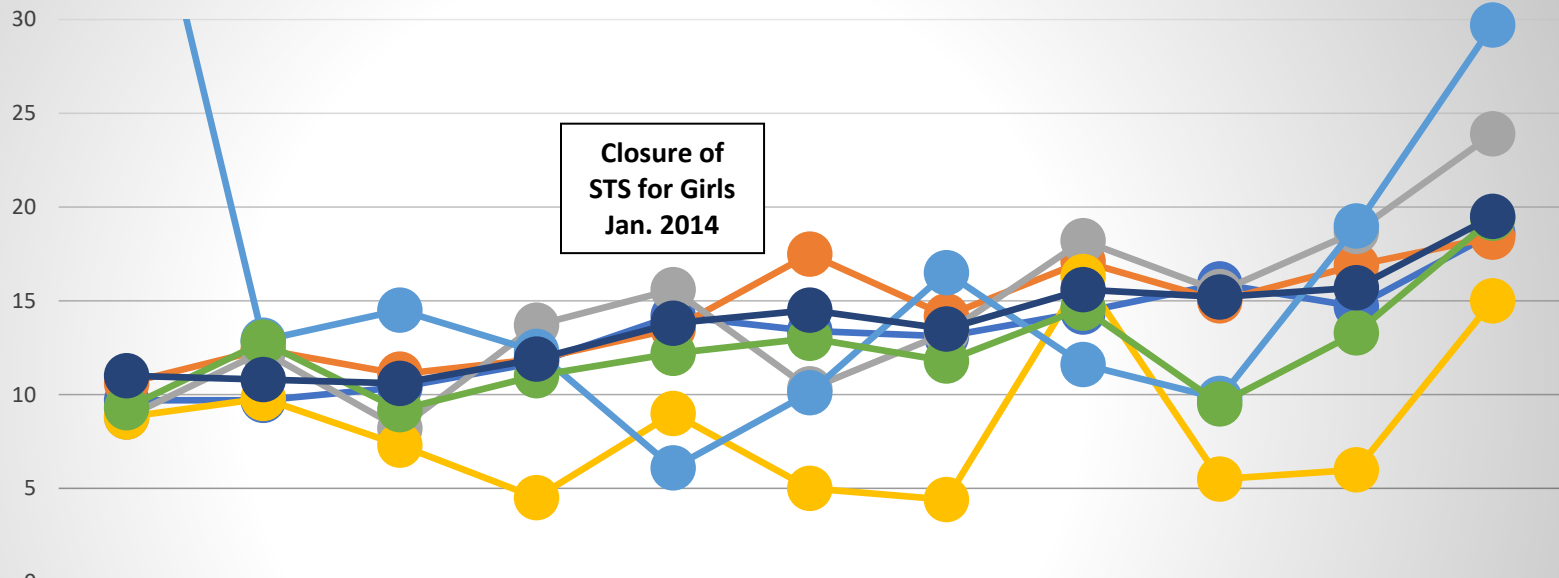

~The average length of stay ALOS for females under JCS supervision first matched the ALOS of males in 2014 and has followed a similar upward trend since.

~The impact of COVID made 2020 an anomalous year, the long-term effect of which is yet unknown. Using 2019 as the last pre-COVID year of data, females ALOS has increased 5.1 days since the low of 10.6 in 2012, while males ALOS increased 2.1 days during that same time frame.

~The ALOS for the Native American females in 2010 was exceptional at 43.3 days. It also represents 15 total detention holds and 650 total detention bed days.

~ The impact of COVID made 2020 an anomalous year, the long-term effect of which is yet unknown. Using 2019 as the last pre-COVID year of data and eliminating the exceptional 2010 year for Native American females, all females regardless of race with the exception of Asian/Pacific Islander females, showed an increase of at least 4 days in their ALOS. Hispanic females had the largest increase (9.9 days).

~White males consistently had the highest volume of detention holds until 2016 when African American male detention holds became larger while detention holds for White males began to shrink. Detention holds of African American males even exceeded those of White males in 2018 despite their being a much smaller population. Hold counts for all other racial/ethnic groups, regardless of year, were considerably lower.
