



Sign Language Interpreter Identifications

This is an interpreter who holds NAD or RID certification or an Educational Interpreter Proficiency Assessment (EIPA) of 3.5 or higher.

The interpreter's name is listed above the license #.


This interpreter has a TEMPORARY license ("T" behind license #). They have not passed a national certification or the EIPA at a 3.5 or higher.

The interpreter's name is listed on the card.



Card shows what level of certification they have from NAD.

What You Need to Know

1. Ask to see the interpreter's license. This should look like one of the first two examples above. If there is a "T" behind their license number, it means they do not have RID or NAD certification or an EIPA level of 3.5 or higher.
2. Ask to see the interpreter's certification card.
3. If an interpreter only shows you a certification card, that does not mean they have a license to work in Iowa.
4. If an interpreter only shows you a membership card to an organization (ISRID, RID, IAD, NAD) that does not mean they have certification.
